NHS Terms and Conditions of Service Handbook (amendment number 26): Pay and Conditions for NHS Staff Covered by the Agenda for Change Agreement

Pay Circular (AforC) 2/2012

Summary

This pay circular informs employers of the changes to the national pay scales that take effect from 1 April 2012 for staff covered by the Agenda for Change agreement. 2012/2013 will be the second year of the Government's pay freeze for public sector workforces, except for those earning a full time equivalent of £21,000 or less. These staff will receive an increase of £250 in 2012/2013.

Action:

Changes to the national pay scales from 1 April 2012

- 1. The revised national pay scales for 2012/13 set out in this circular apply in full from 1 April 2012.
- 2. The changes to pay points on the pay spine and in the pay bands are:
 - a flat rate increase of £250 to pay spine points 1-15
 - all remaining pay points are unchanged.

National Recruitment and Retention Premia: transitional protection arrangements

3. NHS employers are reminded of the arrangements promulgated by Pay Circular (AforC) 3/2011 about transitional protection arrangements following the removal of National Recruitment and Retention Premia. From 1 April 2012 payments are protected at 50% of their current value.

Effect of this amendment

- 4. The revised national rates made effective by this pay circular replace those notified in Pay Circular (AforC)2/2011
- 5. Details of the changes made effective by this circular are in the Annex attached.
