

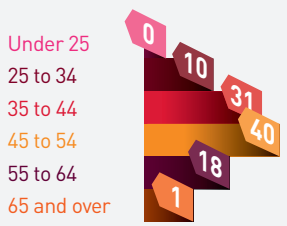

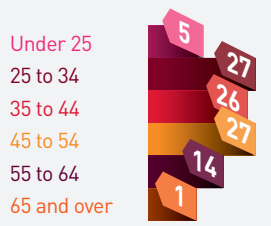

Age breakdown of Agenda for Change staff²

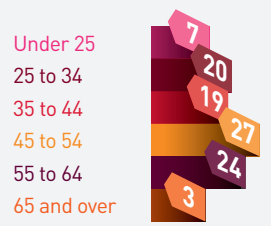

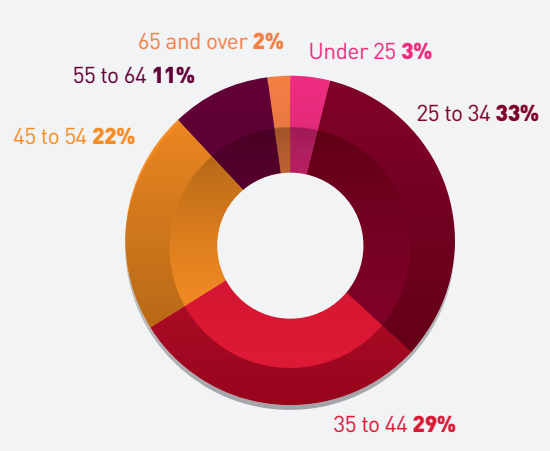

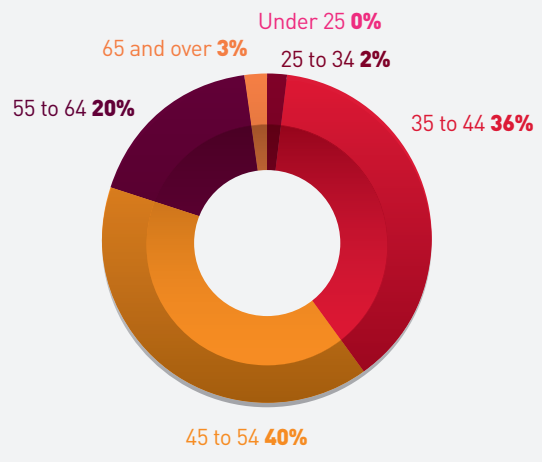
