






The world's most popular English test for study and work





The four sections of the IELTS test



Note: The IELTS on computer Listening test has slightly different timings to IELTS on paper. IELTS on paper requires test takers to transfer their answers to an answer sheet. This step becomes redundant when answering directly on a computer.

The IELTS band score scale – constant for over 30 years

9	Expert user	Has fully operational command of the language: appropriate, accurate and fluent with complete understanding.
8	Very good user	Has fully operational command of the language with only occasional unsystematic inaccuracies and inappropriacies. Misunderstandings may occur in unfamiliar situations. Handles complex detailed argumentation well.
7	Good user	Has operational command of the language, though with occasional inaccuracies, inappropriacies and misunderstandings in some situations. Generally handles complex language well and understands detailed reasoning.
6	Competent user	Has generally effective command of the language despite some inaccuracies, inappropriacies and misunderstandings. Can use and understand fairly complex language, particularly in familiar situations.
5	Modest user	Has partial command of the language, coping with overall meaning in most situations, though is likely to make many mistakes. Should be able to handle basic communication in own field.
4	Limited user	Basic competence is limited to familiar situations. Has frequent problems in understanding and expression. Is not able to use complex language.
3	Extremely limited user	Conveys and understands only general meaning in very familiar situations. Frequent breakdowns in communication occur.
2	Intermittent user	No real communication is possible except for the most basic information using isolated words or short formulae in familiar situations and to meet immediate needs. Has great difficulty understanding spoken and written English.
1	Non user	Essentially has no ability to use the language beyond possibly a few isolated words.
0	Did not attempt the test	No assessable information provided.

We will accept an <u>IELTS **Academic**</u> test result that confirms you achieved at least 7 for reading, listening, and speaking, and at least 6.5 for writing.


If combining two tests, no scores in either of the two test sittings are below 6.5 for listening, reading, and speaking, or below 6 for writing.

- Using the secure IELTS Results Verification Service
- Verifying every Test Report Form online
- Viewing the results as recorded in our global master database

Using the IELTS Results Verification Service will ensure that your organisation will not be defrauded.


Registration

- Register for the new IELTS Results Service at:
 - https://cambridgeenglish.formstack.com/forms/ielts_results_service_application
- Receive your welcome email from the service that includes:
- Immediately log in to the Results Service and accept the Terms & Conditions:
 - This must be completed within 5 days of receiving the welcome email; if not completed within 5 days a password re-set will be required.

On registration completion:

- You are now ready to use the NEW IELTS Results Service
- Add new users and secondary administrators to your account
- Ensure you delete any users who no longer need access to your account, due to change of posts or leaving your organization – as you are responsible for the personal data in your account.
- Bookmark the URL and share it with all users and the secondary administrators (https://www.ielts.org/en-us/ielts-for-organisations/new-ielts-results-service)
- Share the name of your IELTS account (NO codes!) on all appropriate Admissions websites







You must provide your IELTS TRF number when completing the overseas nursing registration process. Your TRF number is the 15-18 digit alpha/numeric combination number found in the bottom right of your Test Report Form as shown on the document below.

The NHS Trust will use the IELTS Results Service to independently verify all IELTS results.












Security principles

Whatever the delivery mode, the overriding principles remain the same:





Security throughout the process

Prior to the test:



Candidate booking requires valid ID



Notifications of malpractice, and investigations



Online monitoring and sweeps for OET test materials - takedown of offending posts and sites

On test day:



Multiple identity checks including ID and image capture



Environmental and candidate person checks



Constant monitoring by trained invigilators/ proctors

After the test:



Statistical analysis

Statistical analysis of results to identify abnormal score patterns.





Malpractice Committee

Reviews test-day security breaches and candidate results and anomalies.





Test Venue Audits

Unannounced site visits and follow-up audits





Verification of results

How to verify OET results

The only way to verify results is using our Results Verification Portal

- 1. Ensure you are a recognising organisation:
 Go to https://oet.com/for-partners/recognising-oet
- 2. Recognise OET:

Once you recogonise OET, authorised personnel will receive access to our Online Results Verification Portal, as well as access forms, user guides and training.


3. Ensure candidates have shared their results: Contact candidates directly to ensure they have shared their results with you via the portal (GDPR).

4. Access the verification portal to find results: For candidates who take OET on Paper, access myOET. For candidates who take OET on Computer or OET@Home, access OET Account.



Where do I verify candidate results?


OET on Paper Candidates - MyOET
